- Establish clear guidelines for students
 - Rubrics
 - Professional vs. social
- Make sure of faculty buy-in
 - Choose appropriate projects
 - Discuss evaluation criteria with faculty
- Consider technology skills of students & faculty

ePortfolio for nursing CPD

Why an ePortfolio for the RDNS CPD Solution?

- In 2010 RDNS Education Centre ran a trial through the Australian Flexible Learning Framework's Implementation Trial funding
- This trial focussed on the nursing student's transition to professional practice
- This gave us the opportunity to see how PebblePad, the ePortfolio system of choice for the trial, could be utilised for managing the new CPD legislation



The CPD legislation

Effective 1 July 2010

- Term is now "hours", not "points"
- www.ahpra.gov.au

Places responsibility for CPD on individual nurses

- linked to scope, context, and role of practice
- CPD activity must come from a learning plan set by each nurse for themselves

Nurses must be able to produce evidence on demand

 1st national audit to take place at or around May 2012

CPD activity must be justified as relevant by nurses as individuals

• 3rd party validation/verification should happen but not essential



Documentation of self-directed CPD

- must include dates
- a brief description of the outcomes
- number of hours spent in each activity
- should be verified




All evidence must demonstrate that the nurse or midwife has:


- Identified and prioritised their learning needs, based on an evaluation of their practice against the relevant competency or professional practice standards
- Developed a learning plan based on identified learning needs
- Participated in effective learning activities relevant to their learning needs
- Reflected on the value of the learning activities or the effect that participation will have on their practice















PICC lines
